#### I. CALL TO ORDER

APPROVAL OF EXPENDITURES – Bills in the Amount of \$2,562,410.29 including SCWRF Project Pay Request #18 for \$1,642,221.50 – Mr. Boyle stated Gerber Construction has submitted Pay Request #18 for \$1,642,221.50 (\$1,728,654.21 less \$86,432.71 retainage of 5%). Work includes: continued setting structural steel members on Headworks Bldg roof and ceiling, finished testing, patching, and re-coating interior walls of Equalization Basins, continued formwork on walls of Bioreactors, poured floor slabs on Clarifier #2 and started excavation of Clarifier #1, finished concrete walls and slabs of Tertiary Filter Bldg, finished welding the roof decking on Solids Bldg, finished laying process piping from Headworks to EQ Basins, set electrical gear in Electrical Building and set outside electrical gear for main feed and Emergency Standby Generator, and continued fire sprinkler piping and set all exterior wall insulation in Operations Bldg.

The work is 52.95% complete. The time elapsed is 42.57%.

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Ms. Pack made the motion to approve the Expenditures, Ms. Matsumoto seconded and the motion carried with Mr. Richer, Ms. Matsumoto, Ms. Pack and Mr. Wilking voting in the affirmative.
